


- We went to the forest

RESULTS



- We assessed the abundance with the Jackknife method
- We assessed that there are 43 species in the meadow and 67 in the forest
- The forest is thus richer than the meadow









- It can reach up to 49m in height. The bark is thin and smooth, ash-gray.
- •Beech forest covers 89% of woodland in Slovenia.
- •The fruit is called a mast.
- •It is eaten by wild boar, doe, roe deer, bear and rodents.

- •It originates in North America. It is invasive in Slovenia. It spread from the gardens.

- •It lives in deciduous and mixed forests of Europe, Asia Minor and by the Caspian Sea
- Weighing up to 35 kg and measuring up to 120 cm
- •Eaten by: wolf, lynx, bear, etc.
- •Roe eats mostly plants; roots, undergrowth, foliage, etc.
- Species: Carpelous carpelous
- •Famila: Cervidae
- Classis: Mammalia
- Subphylum: Vertebrata





- They weigh up to 12 kg
- They live near fresh water, rich in vegetation, in temperate and cold regions throughout the world except in Africa.
- Swans search for food in water and on land. They are herbivorous, they eat plant roots, leaves and buds of aquatic and terrestrial plants.
